### Russia-Part 2

Several months before our trip to Saint Petersburg, our Moscow IPA Connection put us in touch with Olga Birкина, writer, Travel Secretary, All-Russian Police Association, IPA. She planned out our itinerary and kept in constant touch with us. It wasn't until I met her that I realized she was using Google translate. Some of her questions had been quite bizarre. She had been hosting Calvin and Diana Chow prior to their meeting us in Moscow so we felt quite connected.

The train ride from Moscow to Saint Petersburg was very pleasant. It took just shy of four hours to travel the 455 miles at 155 mph. We were unpleasantly surprised at the landscape. We passed many abandoned, dilapidated factories, lots of pasture land but no livestock or farming productivity was evident.

I had failed to tell Olga that we were packing LOTS of luggage. She and a coworker picked us up at the train station in a small car. It was reminiscent of the circus clowns getting stuffed into a VW! We were driven to our hotel on the outskirts of town in a rather interesting neighborhood. The hotel had a large metal fence around it that was locked at night. We got used to the neighborhood and it was a pleasant hotel.

The following morning, Olga came with an interpreter (who was present at all times) and the four of us set off for the state traffic safety museum. I had brought some items for the museum and was pleased to see a lot of American and specifically, California police parapher-

nal. We then went on an On/Off Again bus tour of the city. It was a very warm day and the city was packed with pedestrians and bicyclists. Traffic was unbelievably bad and the drivers, even worse. It is okay to block an intersection in Russia so plain chicken is the way to commute.

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On another day we went to the Peter and Paul Fortress. That was unbelievable. This was an original Citadel founded by Peter the Great in 1703. Later in time, it became a prison and execution ground by the Bolshevik government. Now it is a state museum along with the Cathedral nearby. We got to meet the police chief and were escorted to an area closed to the general public. We were standing a few feet away from two cannons when they were fired off. There was an Army band That did some precision marching. It took all I had not to run out to join the drum line, being a former drum Corps member.

There were a cluster of buildings within the walls that house many museums. At one point, the man in charge of the King Tut exhibition heard we were Americans and came to talk with us. He invited us in to the museum as his guests. Later, we had lunch on the grounds. Our new favorite is Borscht Soup.

That afternoon, we went to The Hermitage. What a place! We were able to bypass the entry lines and come in through the security entrance. We also got to meet the Colonel of the Hermitage Police. It is the second largest art museum in the world. It was founded in 1764 to house Empress Catherine the Greats' impressive art collection. She kept collecting so they kept having to add onto the house. Sound familiar? What was interesting was that she liked staying there by herself and her many cats had the run of the place. Sound familiar? In fact, once a year they have a "Cat Day" where a large number of cats are brought in by the "Press Secretary to the Cats" and a calendar is produced. There are apparently quite a few cats that live in the basement all the time. We were only here for a few hours but a good day, if not two, would really be in order.

Another trip involved going to the Saint Petersburg Police College. There we met director, Oleg Vladimirovich Yarukhin. Talk about command presence! He proudly showed us the facility and explained its goal. You can start at the school at a fairly young age, definitely well before reaching the minimum age requirement to become an officer. That way, young people can determine if, in fact, they are interested in law enforcement and go on to learn the theories of law enforcement and later, some of the practical applications such as firearms, driving, riding horses or scuba diving, taking part in city events at a student community level to name a few. We then retired to his office for coffee and pastries. Note: pastries, no donuts. His office was packed full of all kinds of interesting things. We were joined by an older, retired gentleman who was quite jovial. I must say, he was one of the few "jovial" people I met. Everyone was getting on quite well so that called for Vodka. Well, that loosened up the lock to the gun safe and out came some Russian firearms. Joe was in seventh heaven when he got to handle an AK 47 Kalashnikov, fully auto with a folding stock! More alcohol of an unknown nature. Not to be outdone, Mr. Jovial and I realized I knew the melodies to some Russian operas so we began singing. We were given a ton of mementos. Now Olga realized why we needed so many suitcases. Thank goodness we had a ways to go, to walk to the train station. In case you're curious, no hangover!

You light it and just let dinner at the hotel. Olga

brought a sky lantern (Hot air balloon with candle) for the sendoff. You light it and just let it float away. Joe and I, being over-regulated-on-everything Californians, were scared to death that this would land somewhere and start a fire! It landed on a nearby green lawn so we were relieved. Olga and the translator gave us quite a few mementos and we did likewise. I had brought my Seaside Police Department dress hat with me on this trip. Initially I did not know if I could part with it. I had a history with it dating back to the early 1980s. At the end, I decided to give it to Olga for her museum collection. She really knocked herself out to take care of us. Finally at 11 PM, I told her we had to stop the party! We had to get up at 2 AM, finish packing and be ready for the "big" taxi she had ordered for us, at 3:30 AM to go to the Saint Petersburg airport. A tearful goodbye, until we meet again; the woman travels to IPA events all over. Although we said our goodbyes, she was there at 3:15 and rode with us to the airport.

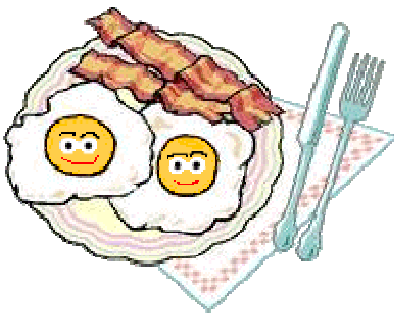
