AROUND THE WORLD

#MeetingattheSummit of Lower Silesian IPA members!

This initiative, started by the members of the IPA Lower Silesian Voivodship Group, is a creative and challenging way for all those IPA members who want to celebrate the 70th Anniversary of the establishment of the International Police Association. In the spirit of the motto "Servo per Amikeco" members are climbing the highest peak of the Sudetes mountain range in the beautiful Lower Silesia – Śnieżka.

Unfortunately, due to the prevailing pandemic, they cannot all meet together, therefore the ascent of 1602 metres above sea level is carried out individually, but as part of the larger intiative. Several dozen members of the Association have already stood on Śnieżka to celebrate the 70th anniversary of the IPA!



The view that stretches from the top of the Queen of the Sudetes is amazing. The whole world is literally below you. Lying at your feet you can see not only the mountain hut "Dom Śląski" and the "Równia pod Śnieżką" plateau, but most of all the picturesque Jelenia Góra Valley. It should be mentioned that Śnieżka can be capricious. It is not always possible to see these wonderful landscapes.

At times the summit is covered with clouds, it rains and a strong wind blows, and the only thing that can be seen is another pole showing where the trail leads. Nevertheless, dozens of Lower Silesian IPA members decided to celebrate 70 years of the Association, which brings together police officers from all over the world.

The pandemic does not give up, and we must take into account various restrictions that prevent the typical, ceremonial celebration of such a jubilee.



However, as shown by the members from Lower Silesia, there is always a way! The IPA Lower Silesian Voivodship Group planned to celebrate the jubilee of our organisation on the top of the highest mountain in Karkonosze and Sudetes Mountains – Śnieżka - "Meeting at the Summit", to strengthen the friendship ties and integrate our members in the spirit of our Association's motto "Servo per Amikeco". As the coronavirus has significantly limited the possibilities of this type of undertaking, IPA members decided to slightly modify their previous plans.

The climbing of the peak takes place individually, and its aim is not only admiring the aforementioned beautiful views, but above all celebrating the Anniversary! But that's not all! In order to commemorate this moment in time and to remember other IPA members, with whom it was

impossible to meet this time, each hiker receives a special pin.

To obtain this memento, each hiker needs to climb to the height of 1602 m and document their achievement, preferably with a photo. There is no denying that it would be even better to pose with a scarf, hat or other item bearing the logo of our Association. All as part of "Servo per Amikeco".

The Queen of the Sudetes has already welcomed dozens of members of the IPA Lower Silesian Voivodship Group, happy to reach the highest peak in this part of Poland. However, this year's campaign is just the beginning. Summit meetings are also planned for the future.

A mountain hike amongst friends from the Association is a great opportunity for talks, exchanging points of view, observations and experiences regarding the difficult service in the blue uniform.



Therefore the IPA from Lower Silesia invites you to next year's climbing of mountain peaks! For now, we encourage you in fighting your weaknesses, steep climbs and difficult weather to get to the Śnieżka peak and to celebrate the long 70 years of the International Police Association!

IPA Brazil initiate two projects for Children's Day 2020

IPA Brazil – through its Directorate of Academic, Cultural and Educational Affairs - developed two beautiful initiatives to celebrate Children's Day on 12 October 2020, aimed at preventing violence and drug misuse.

Project 1 - Social

IPA Brazil organised a day of celebrations in a disadvantaged community, involving lectures related to a prevention project, followed by a tasty lunch and distribution of gifts for children. At the end of the day, all children had the opportunity to have fun in the swimming pool at a water park club partnered with IPA Brazil.

Project 2 - Educational

On Children's Day, IPA Brazil signed a Cooperation Agreement with the Secretary of Education of the Federal District, to distribute educational materials from the IPA Brazil project, highlighting our HQ (Comic Book) related to our heroic media characters, Super "Ipinho" and "Ipinha", as a source for reading, education, prevention of violence, and the misuse of drugs. The Secretary of Education is responsible for delivering educational projects to 26,000 students of various stages, ages and school segments (children and adolescents). With this agreement, the IPA Brazil HQ will appear on the shelves of the reading rooms and libraries of schools in the country. The heroes of our HQ, Super Ipinho and Ipinha will be presented to the IEC at the IPA World Congress 2021 in Spain.

The Comic Book of IPA Brazil in the Brazilian Educational System



The objective of our comic book is to inspire children and adolescents through police officers. The project also presents the opportunity to bring up issues of relevance regarding the prevention of violence, such as the fight against drugs, the destruction of the environment, and the prevention of domestic violence, a sad reality still recorded in Brazil.

A comic book from IPA Brazil to enchant children

The format of the book "Super Ipinho and Ipinha - great heroes, great heroic acts", appeals to many children, and

features the most famous Brazilian superheroes. In the first bilingual edition Portuguese/English, the comic book introduces a teenager who dreams of becoming a cop, and who brings along his cousin. Two young people who, in an extraordinary way, gain superpowers and help fighting crime and containing violence. The book aims at valuing police officers and their actions, as well as their humanitarian approach to society.



Free distribution

To ensure a wider distribution of the comic book to schools both electronically and in book format, we provide the PDF free of charge for common use.

In addition to aiming at enhancing the image of the police, we endeavour to establish an open channel of communication for future exchanges between various educational institutions.

IPA Ireland explore new territory holding their first virtual National Council Meeting

I am pleased to share an account of an historic Extraordinary National Council Meeting of Section Ireland, convened for the purpose of ensuring the Rules of our section are adhered to during the Covid-19 pandemic. This is the first time since the foundation of Section Ireland in 1955, that this particular provision has been invoked, and this time, to deal solely with the situation of grave importance foisted upon us by Covid-19, which is being experienced worldwide at present.

Our Rules provide for holding of an Extraordinary National Council Meeting to deal with matters of "grave importance", and have thankfully sat idle in our Rules and Schedules booklet for many years. It is not unreasonable to say, now in 2020, that the Covid-19 pandemic has brought with it a situation, where the National Executive Committee (NEC) had no option but to invoke those provisions.

The NEC agreed that the management of forthcoming Regional Congresses, Regional Elections, National Council 2020, and National Congress 2021 together with the scheduled election of NEC, Standing Orders Committee (S.O.C.), Internal Auditors (IA) and Honorary Life Membership (HLM) Committee all constituted matters of "grave importance" for our Association and this Section.



The Covid-19 pandemic has been designated a national crisis by the Irish government, and IPA Ireland accepts that we are morally and legally bound to adhere to governmental directives and Health Services Executive guidelines. At present, the law dictates that it would be unlawful to hold the type of physical meeting that we require for National Council. In addition to that, IPA Ireland could not countenance a situation, where our members would be called together by way of an open meeting and run the risk of members falling ill with Covid-19 as a result.

The pandemic placed our section in a very difficult and unprecedented position in respect of Regional Elections, which in themselves are a prerequisite for the completion of Regional Congresses 2020 and the holding of NEC elections in 2021. The NEC is at all times cognisant of the fact that our Rules and Schedules place obligations on us in respect of the management of this Section and the holding of Regional meetings, National Council, National Congress and the election of Regional Committees. National Executive Committee, S.O.C, IA and HLM Committees. Being unable to hold those because of the pandemic, the NEC turned to the Delegates of our Regions and asked for their support in suspending those obligations, which, through no fault of our own, we are unable to meet.

Such suspension will be temporary, with a specified end date and the provision built in, that the suspension will be reversed before such end-date if the Covid-19 situation should allow. The NEC met by Zoom on 27 August 2020 and agreed that an Extraordinary National Council (ENC) Meeting be held under the provisions of our Rules. That ENC took place on 25 September 2020, to consider a motion proposed by the NEC, for a suspension for a period of not more than one year and ending no later than 25 September 2021 for the provisions relating to:

- the 3-year term of office for the Immediate Past President,
- the holding of a National Council Meeting each year and the National Congress every third year,
- the requirements for Regional Meetings to be held quarterly, for a Regional AGM, and for a Regional Congress in October 2020.
- the term of office for the NEC of 3 years, as well as for standing orders, Honorary Life Membership Committees, and Internal Auditors.

Notwithstanding a suspension, the NEC would be actively pursuing the holding of a National Council Meeting in April 2021, Covid-19 permitting. Because Regions are unable to hold Regional Congresses, this National Council cannot be designated a National Congress, therefore the motion also requested for the National Congress be moved to 2021. The proposed suspension would allow for that.



The National Executive Committee recommended this motion at the Extraordinary National Council Meeting, held via Zoom and attended by 55 Delegates representing our Regions. Each Delegate was afforded an opportunity to comment, and the motion was passed unanimously on a vote by the Delegates and members of the NEC.

On behalf of the NEC of Section Ireland, I am very pleased with the great support given and the unwavering confidence shown in the current management of our Section by all of the Delegates, and I am very grateful to our Regions for the show of support and confidence.

IPA UK launch Family History Special Interest Group

In July 2020, following expressions of interest from several Section UK members who have a wide interest in family history and genealogy, an inaugural online meeting was held. The range of experience of those attending varied between members who have long been involved in such research, to members who are inexperienced and in the early stages of tracing and recording such information.

It was agreed that a formal structure and purpose for the Group should be identified in accordance with the Section UK Directive on Special Interest Groups (SIG's).

The Section UK Family History Group was formed. The purpose of the Group is to:

'Act as a mutually supportive group of Section UK Genealogists whose aim is to exchange views, knowledge, experience and best practice in the research of Family Ancestry. Where possible, to assist international IPA members in their similar research when it is identified within the boundary of IPA Section UK, thereby building upon friendships and support, a hugely important and increasingly vital part of the International Police Association'.

Entry into the Group is restricted to members of the IPA UK, and at present we have 170 members, a number that is rising.



Regular online meetings are held by the group for everyone to take part in open discussions on their experiences in research and to answer questions that have been forwarded beforehand. There are additional online tutoring sessions designed specifically for absolute beginners new to family history research. It is anticipated that smaller and more local groups will eventually be formed, so that experienced researchers can mentor the less experienced.

The committee recognise that it is highly likely that research will often cross international boundaries. Therefore, international members would often be undertaking research into the history of their own families, which would reach across into the United Kingdom. The members recognise that there may be instances where international members may seek assistance from the UK Family History Group to clarify certain aspects of their research, to obtain photographic evidence of historical addresses or similar. Within reason, the members have agreed that in the spirit of IPA international friendship, they will endeavour to offer such assistance whenever possible.

It should however be realised that within the United Kingdom, there may often be instances where certain investigations require financial payments to commercial or private organisations to access and recover supportive evidence. In such circumstances, agreement to pay those costs would be required to be made by the member seeking assistance. Importantly, we would anticipate that such members seeking assistance would already be a subscriber within their home country to a commercial family history research facility, such as <u>www.ancestry.com</u>,

<u>www.findmypast.com</u> or other similar organisations, and have already commenced such research themselves.

The Section UK Family History SIG would welcome linking with any IPA section who has also put in place a similar historical research group, including possible online joint meetings and discussions or even international visits when circumstances once again permit such unrestricted travel. Hopefully, such international links would also result in agreed reciprocal facilities to UK members for research within other countries.


We are looking forward to reading their reports, which will either be published in the IPA Newsletter or posted on the IPA website and circulated to all IPA sections.

Arthur Troop Scholarship 2022

The Arthur Troop Scholarship (ATS) 2022 is now open for applications from IPA members worldwide. Arthur Troop Scholarships are awarded annually, and preferably at least one will be granted to each continent in which we have member sections – Africa, America, Asia, Australasia and Europe.



Each scholarship consists of a bursary of up to $2500 \in$, to be used for a seminar at the International Conference Centre IBZ Schloss Gimborn, or at a comparable institution.

Applicants must have been an IPA member for at least 3 years before applying, and the scholarship must be taken between 1 January and 31 December of the year following the awarding of the scholarship.

Arthur Troop Scholarships may be awarded to any IPA member active in a law enforcement role, but are predominantly targeted at our younger members. Applicants are required to submit the ATS Application

Form setting out their reasons to support their selection.

The International Administration Centre (IAC) will contact the relevant national sections for confirmation of IPA membership of the applicants after receiving the electronic applications.

The Chairperson of the Professional Commission (PC) will thereafter process the applications with the assistance of his commission members. After the assessment of the PC and the decision of the IEB, awardees for 2022 will be announced during the IPA World Congress in Spain in October 2021.

The deadline for applications for the awards for 2022 is 31 March 2021.




